

All-team Meeting Notes

Call to order 9:16 am

Intros and team round robin-

Colin- rotating out co-chair position; Jeanette (*co-chair of Resident Momentum Team*) Nohelia and Virginia can update; Nohelia (*Lead Organizer Mid-City CAN*) second cycle of house meetings have begun; Mark (*Youth Organizer Mid-City CAN*) youth ambassadors will attend momentum teams, expect influx of youth. Elected youth co-chairs: Eduardo and Jack. Great success at BHC Youth Kick-off with 60+ youth; which was facilitated by CANFIT. Carolyn (*Communications Resource Team*) on April 8th 5:30-7:30pm at Mid-City CAN offering on camera media training; Ramla (*co-chair of School Attendance*) aligned vision to priorities and resulted in 3 outcomes. These are parallel with peace promotion and food justice; Fernanda; Virginia (*alternate co-chair of Resident Momentum Team*) she held first house meeting. At the last RMT meeting there was a panel of house meeting leaders speaking about their house meeting experiences. She believes we need to be clear about community congress and implementation period. Marc (*Conflict Resolution Team*) hasn't met recently and are in the process of recruiting new people. Holding Exchange Trainings to offer resources to deal with conflicts in their teams (next available training is 3/23-3/24). Next meeting is Monday March 15, 2010 at 5pm at the Center for Community Counseling; Kristi (*co-chair of Senior Resource Team and Youth Resource Team*) are aiming to create intergenerational programs, participated in the BHC youth kick off event, interested in creating intergenerational center for seniors; Brenton (*Youth Resource team*) looking for strategies, providing youth with tools; offering workshops to make them feel comfortable and knowledgeable about May 1st event; searching for internship program and have created binders with past minutes for each Momentum Team; Greg (*Legal Resource Team*) continue to offer trainings about health access; staffed legal clinic at Hoover and Crawford and continue to volunteer to provide support around immigration (high concern); Steve (*TCE*) 12 out of 14 sites have completed prioritization. Some of the common outcomes are 5 and 7 (outcome 10 only in South Sacramento that shares similar diversity to City Heights. Will report between sites). Jesse (*anti-systemic racism*) Will present to health care access teams, have presented at Fresno and to Built Environment Momentum Team. Interested in building a perspective that is from the grassroots up; Shukri (*co-chair of Health Access Momentum Team*) chose priority as outcome 2 and aimed to align vision to what residents said. Thanked Sheila Mitra-Sarkar for presenting to this momentum team; Melisa (*co-chair of School Attendance*) they are interested in having a cultural dinner in April to not lose momentum; Jen (*co-chair of Food Justice Momentum Team*) prioritized outcome 7 to align with residents. Next meeting is 3/24 from 12-2pm at the Wellness Center; Irasema (*facilitator to Built Environment Momentum Team, and Access to Health Care MT*); Bill (*facilitator of Food Justice Momentum Team and Resident Momentum Team*); Sheila (*data*) created different slides presentations for different momentum teams, presented at networking council; Rich (*co-chair of the Built Environment Momentum Team*) developing work plan for capacity building as primary strategy; Georgette (*co-chair of the Built Environment Momentum Team*) focused on outcome 4 but developing a menu of

options for capacity building in order to advocate and to set steps for resident involvement. Dana (*co-chair of Peace Promotion Momentum Team*) focused on outcome 5 and 7 and creating strategies to overcome fear; Paul (facilitator to School Attendance and Peace Promotion Momentum Team); Jackie (*logic model coach*) had waited to be invited to City Heights, a vibrant community with its share of issues. She is here as an advisor to offer tips; Diana (*Director of Mid-City CAN*); Jen (*co-chair of coordinating council*) facilitating in the absence of Paul K.

Presentation of emerging process document

-Handout was passed and co-chairs were asked to sit with a co-chair they did not know. They were asked to discuss the handout for five minutes and then comment.

Comments:

- 1) Need to include all team vision details to show support for all issues discussed.
- 2) categories need to be revised to include:
 - transformed education
 - culture of community safety
 - Locally affordable housing
 - thriving local economy
 - favorably resolved immigration status

Questions and other comments

- 1) Who is this document prepared for? A. California Endowment. We do not expect this to be distributed at this time. A document needs to be submitted to TCE and later prepared to be more readable for residents and others.
- 2) This should be a tool to take back to momentum teams, that can help explain where we are at in the process (e.g. Outcome 7 overlaps) in an effective way.
- 3) Directed to Built Environment Momentum Team- what does it mean to build capacity? A. BHC supports agencies who in turn support agencies. BEMT needs to identify trainings to lead our work. Reflecting on Jesse's trainings, trainings need to be offered at a level that can raise consciousness. Dana added that the BEMT developed a template that she would like to use for Peace Promotion that explains data because she is concerned at developing capacity in her team. Jayne added, we need to develop capacity because its hard to understand definitions in this process.
- 4) Why is the Food Justice Momentum team not reflected in the vision? A. It's in the details. It needs to be reformatted to add details. Bill will revise. Diana added that we need to be conscientious about who is reading the document.

Targeted changes are the what; what do you want to change. Strategies are the how; how will you make the changes. I am really glad you did
